NATO: An Evolving Alliance



United in the face of profound security threats and challenges, in particular the long- term threat posed by Russia to Euro-Atlantic security and the persistent threat of terrorism, Allies commit to invest 5% of GDP annually on core defence requirements as well as defence-and security-related spending by 2035 to ensure our individual and collective obligations, in accordance with Article 3 of the Washington Treaty.

Standardization - What?-



NATO standardization is the development and implementation of procedures, designs and terminology to the level necessary for the interoperability required by Allies, or to recommend useful practices in multinational cooperation".





Levels of Standardization





COMMONALITY

The **same** doctrine, procedure or equipment are used.





INTERCHANGEABILITY

One product, process or service to be **used in place of another.**






COMPATIBILITY

Products, processes or services can be used together under specific conditions.



Standardization - Why? -

"...to support achieving, maintaining and enhancing interoperability"

in order to

- improve efficiency in the use of available resources
- strengthen Alliance defence capabilities
- enhance Alliance's operational effectiveness

Policy vs. Standard

	Scope	Definition	Example
POLICY	Broad and high- level statement of intent Why, What and Who	Agreed principles, approach and general objectives, set out in a document, to guide the achievement of specific outcomes	Policy for Standardization
STANDARD	Specific Requirements about a given technology or area How	Document, established by consensus and approved by a recognized body, that provides, for common and repeated use, rules, guidelines or characteristics for activities or their results	AAP-03






