# Why standardize terminology?



In an organization like NATO, different understandings of terms may lead to inefficiency, misunderstanding, disagreement, or worse...

# Interoperability through standardization

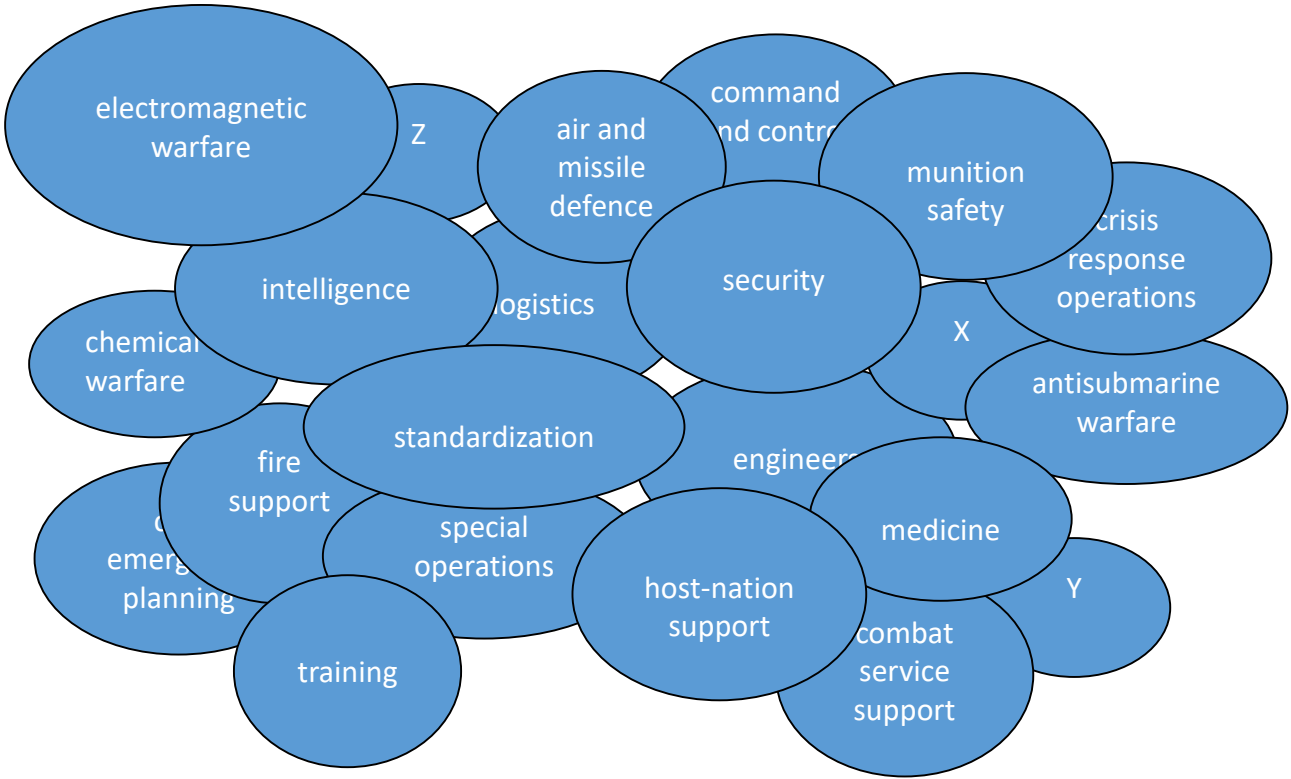


NATO has chosen to enhance **interoperability**, among others, through **standardization**.

Soon after NATO was established in 1949 expert groups start to develop their own terminology without any coordination...





## Policy objective

Since the year 2000, terminology is a **standardization policy objective**:

“The Alliance shall promote understanding through the selection or development and use of commonly-agreed, well-defined, clear, precise, consistent, gender-neutral and bilingual (English/French) terminology. NATO Agreed terminology shall be used in NATO standardization documents.”

(PO(2016)0315 Revised NATO Policy for Standardization)

Since the year 2000, terminology is a **standardization policy objective**:

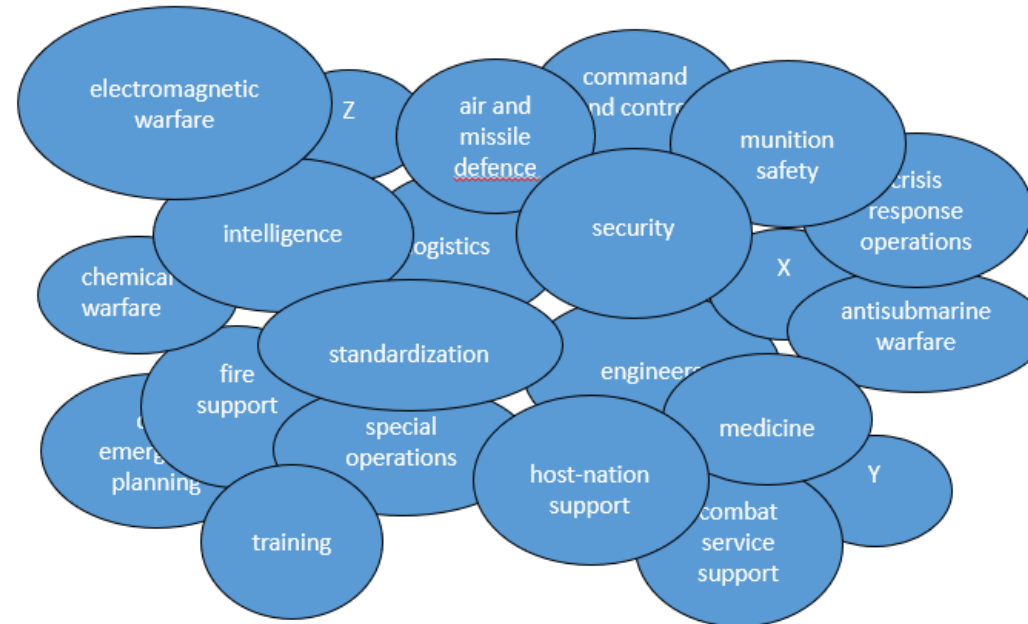

## Process

---

# A four-phase process...



**01**

## Submission

*Authors of documents check their terminology against **NATOTerm** and submit proposals as required, in accordance with **AAP-77**.*

**02**

## Development

*Proposals are reviewed by subject-matter experts and NTO till consensus on both **form** and **substance** is reached.*

**03**

## Approval

*Mature terminology is then submitted by NTO to the appropriate **approving authority** for approval. Decision is **consensus-based**.*

**04**

## Promulgation

*Upon approval, NTO promulgates agreed terminology in **NATOTerm** so that it can be shared and reused in NATO documents.*
