Partners' Adoption of NATO Standards


- ✓ <u>Adoption</u>: process in which Partner a nation analyses standards covered by a STANAG in order to determine the national position regarding the implementation (identify if, and how to implement them).
- ✓ Partner nations are invited to implement promulgated Allied standards, especially when planning to contribute to NATO activities.
- ✓ The "adoption" is a formal approval with the aim of full or partial IMPLEMENTATION of a NATO standard.
- ✓ Completion of process results in an adoption report provided using the electronic reporting tool on the NSO protected website



NATO STANDARDIZATION OFFICE (NSO) ADVICE FOR PARTNERS' REQUESTS TO RELEASE CLASSIFIED NATO OPERATIONAL STANDARDIZATION DOCUMENTS

- The NATO Standardization Office (NSO) greatly appreciates the contribution of Partners to interoperability with NATO Allies, especially NATO standardization. The NSO actively supports partner Nations' efforts to improve their interoperability with the Alliance. This letter is one part of the NSO's response to challenges identified on the subject of gaining timely release of NATO standards, when requested by Partners.
- This letter provides advice to assist NATO partner Nations with drafting and delivering requests to the Bi-SC Military Partnership Directorate (MPD) at SHAPE for the release of NATO standardization documents.
- 3. <u>Specificity</u>. Each request should be limited to the applicable portion of the requested document. This is especially true for rapidly developing or particularly sensitive information (e.g. Anti-Submarine Warfare and Joint Intelligence publications). The release of an individual section may be more likely to be approved than the release of an entire publication, because there is less material which all Allies must agree to release.
- 4. <u>Justification</u>. To gain Allies' approval, requests must provide a thorough justification, for what reasons / events your Nation requests the release of this document (e.g. participation in a NATO exercise, operation, etc.). Requests should include as much detail as possible to assist Allies with their decisions in each case.
 - a. <u>Programmes</u>. Whenever possible, requests should reference specifics of the requesting Nation's partnership programme(s) with NATO.
 - b. <u>Capabilities offered for Alliance activities</u>. Each request should be linked to a specific type of capability which they are developing, exercising or deploying with NATO Allies. For example, if a Partner's participation in the NATO Response Force (NRF) is the basis of the justification, then additional details such as the participating unit, its role in NRF, the particular relationship between the content of the requested publication and the unit, and the potential lack of capability/effectiveness resulting from non-release may be useful.¹

NATO UNCLASSIFIED Releasable to EAPC, MD, ICI, PatG and MSHT

To support that consensus-based decision, *persuade* Allies with:

- ✓ Any applicable Partnership Goal(s)
- ✓ Any specific part of the publication
- ✓ Any endorsement, including detailed justification, from the PD Regional Officer and/or other NATO Entities
- ✓ Partner unit(s) offered for participation in NATO exercises or operations; and
- ✓ Date of associated exercise or operation (for time-sensitive requests).

¹ Requests are normally non-classified, but classified requests may be necessary to include detailed justification.
